I hereby certify that on October 16, 2014, the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, by unanimous roll call vote, and pursuant to K.S.A. 65-4102(e), adopted K.A.R. 68-20-31 as a temporary regulation. In adopting the temporary regulation, the Kansas Board of Pharmacy found that the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare necessitates and makes desirable putting the regulation into effect prior to the time it could be put into effect if the Board were to comply with the notice, hearing, and publication requirements of this act or prior to the effective date prescribed by K.S.A. 77-4261 and amendments thereto. The Kansas Board of Pharmacy also initiated a proceeding under K.S.A. 65-4102(a) pursuant to the substance scheduled by the temporary regulation. K.A.R. 68-20-31 is hereby filed for adoption, and the Economic Impact Statement is enclosed.

**KANSAS BOARD OF PHARMACY
ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT
K.A.R. 68-20-31**

I. Summary of Proposed Regulation, Including Its Purpose.

K.A.R. 68-20-31 is a new temporary regulation that classifies 2,5-dimethoxy-4-methyl-n-(2-methoxybenzyl)phenethylamine, including its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, as a schedule I controlled substance.

II. Reason or Reasons the Proposed Regulation Is Required, Including Whether or Not the Regulation Is Mandated by Federal Law.

The Board of Pharmacy was requested by the Johnson County Assistant District Attorney, pursuant to K.S.A. 21-5715 to adopt a temporary regulation scheduling of 2,5-dimethoxy-4-methyl-n-(2-methoxybenzyl)phenethylamine, including its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers, as a controlled substance analog. This temporary regulation is necessary to protect the public health safety and welfare. This regulation is not mandated by federal law.

III. Anticipated Economic Impact upon the Kansas Board of Pharmacy.

The Board does not anticipate any economic impact.

IV. Anticipated Financial Impact upon Other Governmental Agencies and upon Private Business or Individuals.

The Board does not anticipate a financial impact on other governmental agencies or on private businesses, other than the costs associated with prosecuting and defending criminal charges for illegally possessing this substance.
